OVERCOMING FEAR

As I was contemplating an appropriate message to share in these difficult times, I had one of those stay-in-touch telephone conversations that all of us are having these days, with my brother in central Pennsylvania. He is also a retired Lutheran pastor. In the course of that communication he noted that he had just received a congregational letter from the president of the church council in the parish where he and his wife are members which included a unique sharing of some material from one of Dietrich Bonhoeffer's sermons. I asked him to forward it to me and once I saw it I knew it was something I needed to share in these tumultuous times.

This sermon, titled *Overcoming Fear* was preached on Sunday, January 15, 1933 (The Second Sunday of Epiphany), shortly before the Nazis came to power in Germany. The Gospel reading was from Matthew 8:23-27 and Bonhoeffer's sermon included this advice:

The overcoming of fear – that is what we are proclaiming here. The Bible, the gospel, Christ, the church, the faith – all are one great battle cry against fear in the lives of human beings. Fear is, somehow or other, the archenemy itself. It crouches in people's hearts. It hollows out their insides, until resistance and strength are spent and they suddenly break down. Fear severely gnaws and eats away at all the ties that bind a person to God and to others, and when in time of need that person reaches for those ties and clings to them, they break and the individual sinks back into himself or herself, helpless and despairing, while hell rejoices.

Ironically, although we are confronted with a very different crisis, it is of such consequence that it has the potential of overwhelming us. There are places in our nation and throughout the world where life has come to a virtual standstill. There are families that have lost several members in very brief periods of time, while the circumstances were such that loved ones could not even be with their family members as they were dying. Although the world has been confronted with serious issues in its history, the fact is there has never been anything quite like this. The world is indeed crying out in despair. And, thanks be to God, as Dietrich Bonhoeffer continues his sermon he reminds us of the role faith plays in helping us deal with the major crises of our world.

...We hear people tell us “God is against us, and we have to accept it.”...This is the cry out of the very depths of despair. There is only one thing that helps, and it is what the church does with any of us who thinks and feels this way. It takes the cross and places it before our eyes and asks – Did God abandon him? And since God did not abandon Jesus, we will not be abandoned by God, either...We say there are no miracles anymore...but what do we know really, you and I...

The Easter promise is that God will be with us through thick and thin – through life and death. Although our remembrance of this truth may have been difficult in this season, it was not nearly as unusual as was the celebration of that first Easter. Thanks be to God, we have not been abandoned!
