ELCA's Annual Congregation Report & The Ethnic Question Part 1

Dear Lehigh Mission District,

"These are always hard to answer" read the fluorescent orange Post-It Note attached to the annual Congregation Report that the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America sends churches each year in the United States.

The church administrative assistant's note referred to items number nine and ten of the congregation report. The question is on "Race/ethnic origin." The boxed choices in the report asks the number of church participants of these categories: African American/Black, African National/African Caribbean, American Indian/Alaska Native, Arab/Middle Eastern, Asian/Pacific Islander, Latino/Hispanic, Multiracial, White.

I fit into various categories. African Caribbean, American Indian (Indigenous), and White (Spanish European), Latino/Hispanic, and Multiracial. What can I say? I am Puerto Rican.

How do I categorize my curly-hair-white-complexed son who would show up to track and field one week wearing Puerto Rican flag running shorts and the German flag shorts the next week? It was a delight to see him fly over the hurdles. He wanted to honor his Puerto Rican Papi and German descent Mommy. Do I check the category Multiracial? Latino/Hispanic? White? He appears to feel all of the above.

This is a difficult question. Pastors across the ELCA are given the responsibility to look from their pulpit and to guesstimate what ethnic backgrounds are seated in the church pews and then place them in one of the boxes of the congregation report.

According to the report's instructions, "This is not an exact count but an informed estimate. The number should reflect the participant's self-identification of race/ethnicity origin as much as possible. "Multiracial" is provided for people of mixed race/ethnicity."

Perhaps the problem lies on this idea of race in the report. Black is not a race. White is not a race. Is Multiracial a race? Black and white are skin pigmentations. Under this understanding, my son's skin pigmentation boxes him into the "White" category. One can argue that's why there's the "Multiracial" box for him. But is this category a race or even an ethnicity?

The report gives the impression it appears that the "White" box category is for the American born Lutheran. It sounds like there's some white privilege going on for a few.

Before the umlaut (ü) was dropped off his name and Americanized to Henry Muhlenberg, the German-born immigrant was Heinrich Melchior Mühlenberg.

While the approach to race and ethnic categories on the report may be questionable, the report is about the ethnic immigrant diversity found in the Lutheran North American landscape.
